<b>MINUTES</b>
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Members present: Supervisor Wilson, Chair; Mayor Oden, Vice-Chair; Tribal Vice-Chair Lyons; Council Member Roberts; Mayor Welch; Tribal Alternate, Butch Murphy; Supervisor Ashley.

Members absent: Tribal Council Member Salgado; City Alternate, Council Member Wilson; County Alternate, Supervisor Venable.

**I. Call to Order, roll call, and Welcome**

Supervisor Wilson called the meeting to order at 3 p.m., and led the Pledge of Allegiance. CBC staff called the committee's roll.

**II. Adoption of Minutes – May 24, 2004**

The minutes of the May 24, 2004 meeting were approved as submitted.

During a subsequent review, CBC staff noticed an error regarding the committee's approved allocation of funds for the Twenty-Nine Palms Band. The meeting minutes incorrectly reflected staff's recommendations for allocation of the 60% Nexus Grants to the Cities of Indio and Coachella, and to the County District Attorney. The omission was the division of the 20% Non-Nexus funds equally between the three jurisdictions, due to no applications being received by the CBC in the 20% Non-Nexus grant category. The amounts the committee recommended are:

City of Indio, Fire Services - \$78,910  
City of Coachella, Law Enforcement / Fire Services - \$78,910  
County District Attorney, Law Enforcement - \$38,434

### III. Allocation Recommendations

The CBC voted to make the following funding allocation recommendations to the State Controller:
